Web Access

A copy of the draft Infrastructure Rehabilitation Program (IRP) is available for review on the City of Memphis webpage. The Program may be reviewed by accessing the City’s webpage at: <http://cityofmemphis.org/>. Scroll to the bottom of the page and click on the Public Works link located in the column entitled Government. Go to the right hand side of the Public Works webpage and click on Consent Decree under the LINKS column. On the right hand side of the Consent Decree webpage click on Infrastructure Rehabilitation Program. On this page, click on Draft IRP – Subject to Public Comment.

Paper Copy

A copy of the draft IRP is available for review in the Memphis Shelby County Room, fourth floor of the Central Library located at 3030 Poplar. The librarian at the reference desk on this floor will provide assistance to retrieve the document.

Synopsis

The IRP provides the general guidelines the City will use for prioritizing repairs, maintenance, or re-assessment of the components of the wastewater collection and transmission system (“WCTS”). Infrastructure includes manholes, pipes, lift stations, and other associated parts. These activities, as defined in the IRP, may include but are not limited to the following:

1. Open Cut Pipe Replacement - This process involves excavating and removing damaged pipe/manhole and replacing with new pipe/manhole.
2. Cured In Place Pipe – This process consist of installing a liner in an existing pipe/manhole.
3. Point Repairs – A point repair is the removal and replacement of a damaged section of pipe/manhole or patching a damaged section of pipe/manhole.
4. Lift Station Repair – This process includes repairing and/or replacing mechanical/electrical/plumbing/structural features of a lift station to enhance performance.
5. Maintenance Activities – This includes establishing maintenance procedures to maintain proper operation of the WCTS.
6. Re-Assessment – This includes scheduling the component for future re-assessment in accordance with the CSAP.

The IRP allows for other techniques to be used to rehabilitate and maintain the system. The appropriate techniques will be utilized based on the field conditions encountered.
